The same church that once sheltered freedom seekers on the Underground Railroad and welcomed Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass to its pulpit inspired the creation of an organization dedicated to advancing justice, opportunity, and community strength in Bedford-Stuyvesant and Central Brooklyn.

A Few More Clues in Brooklyn

The heritage of The Underground Railroad signifies the depth of Black strength through struggle. The network=s mere existence speaks to one of Black America=s extraordinary moments in history, hence the need for the preservation of discovered safe houses and checkpoints along the route.

Within New York State, there are over 30 recognized sites, several of which are located in Brooklyn, such as the Lafayette Avenue Presbyterian Church, and the original Bridge Street Church. However, a local group of homeowners on Duffield Street believe they have found another station beneath their homes in downtown Brooklyn. But the homes are slated for demolition to make way for Willoughby Square Park, the centerpiece of the Downtown Brooklyn Redevelopment Plan=s new office development.



Founding Chief Executive Officer, Bridge Street Development Corporation



Colvin Grannum is the Founding President & CEO of Bridge Street Development Corporation and Retired President & CEO of Bedford Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation.

Colvin led Bridge Street through its formative years, transforming the vision of Bridge Street AME Church into a thriving community development corporation. Under his leadership, Bridge Street established a strong foundation in affordable housing, small business support, and youth and senior services — work that continues to impact thousands of residents today. In 2001, Colvin assumed leadership of Bedford Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation, the nation's first community development corporation, where he served for two decades. There, he advanced ambitious initiatives in housing, commercial revitalization, job training, health and wellness, and cultural programming, leaving a legacy of innovation and impact that has touched generations of Brooklyn residents.

Colvin's leadership extends far beyond Central Brooklyn. He currently serves as chair of the Center for New York City Neighborhoods and Bedford Stuyvesant Early Childhood Development Center, Inc. as well as a member of the boards of the Levitt Foundation and Carver Federal Savings Bank. He has served as a member of the Executive Committees of the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC), the Association for Neighborhood & Housing Developers (ANHD), and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Other former boards include New York City Workforce Investment Board, the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce and NYC Housing Development Corporation.

LISC and the New York Housing Conference recognized him with lifetime achievement awards. Prior to his leadership roles in community development, Colvin practiced law in both the private and public sectors. He is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and Georgetown University Law Center.

Colvin's visionary leadership, integrity, and lifelong commitment to empowering communities have made him one of Brooklyn's most respected civic leaders. His enduring contributions exemplify Bridge Street's mission of Building on Community Strength, and his legacy continues to inspire the next generation of community builders. He has been married to Sandra J. Grannum, Esq. for 45 years with whom he shares a son, Jordan Jefferson Grannum.



DR. ROBERT WILLIAMS

Dr. Robert Williams, Jr. is a proud Vietnam Veteran, lifelong Bedford-Stuyvesant resident, and devoted son of Bridge Street AME Church. For more than forty years, he has been a pioneering educator and speech-language pathologist, dedicating his career to helping children and adults find their voices.

Inspired by his own early challenges in a college phonetics class, Dr. Williams transformed difficulty into purpose. He went on to earn advanced degrees from Emerson College, Florida State University, and Columbia University, and became a respected scholar and practitioner. His career has spanned teaching at Howard University and Old Dominion University, directing the Speech and Hearing Center at Harlem Hospital, and decades of service in Atlanta and New York City public schools, where he championed innovative therapies and assistive technologies for students with special needs. He continues to teach at Borough of Manhattan Community College, inspiring new generations of students.

Beyond his professional achievements, Dr. Williams has always been a servant leader. At Bridge Street AME Church, he has served as trustee, Church School Superintendent, and leader in the Veterans Ministry and Lay Organization. As President of the 575 Hancock Street HDFC, he has advanced affordable housing for local families, ensuring that Bedford-Stuyvesant remains a place where neighbors can thrive.

Dr. Williams attributes his many accomplishments to his faith, his family, and the enduring support of the Bridge Street community. His life is a testament to perseverance, service, and the transformative power of education and faith.

SUZETTE BATHER-TAYLOR

Suzette Bather-Taylor is a dynamic leader in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, and a proud resident of Bedford-Stuyvesant. As Program Director for Business Diversity at the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, she has played a central role in advancing participation goals on some of the region's most ambitious infrastructure projects, including the \$19 billion redevelopment of JFK Airport. Her work ensures that minority- and women-owned businesses, service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, and small enterprises have access to opportunities in finance, design, construction, and airport operations.

Suzette's career reflects a deep and lasting commitment to opening doors for underrepresented entrepreneurs. Coupled with her executive training at the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth and an MBA from Pace University, Suzette has built a career defined by innovation, leadership, and measurable impact.

Recognized for her vision and tenacity, Suzette has received honors from Airports Council International-North America and the Northeast Chapter of the American Association of Airport Executives. She is also a member of the ACE Health Foundation's ACE Global Leaders of Excellence Network.


